over the duration or the tram road works no mention has been made of the time which regular commuters lost due to delays, route changes etc. I travel daily to work my trip takes one hour and involves changing buses at the west end of Edinburgh, when the Tram works got underway my journey time increased on average to one hour 20 minutes this was twice a day.

I was not advised in advance of route changes, bus stop changes or diversions. Normally this would not have been a great issue, but over the years it would become a major issue not only for me but countless other commuters and travellers especially for early morning commuters who would arrive at their bus stop only to find it had been changed over night.

The most common question would be 'does anyone know where the bust stop is for the"

It does not take much to calculate what this represents on a weekly/monthly/ yearly basis. The total inconvenience to all commuters over the years this project took must be incalculable. All we get in return is increased bus fares and a tram system which is 2nd class

As I mentioned I lost a considerable amount of time due the Tram works 30 to 40 minutes a day wasted sitting buses, this would have been acceptable over a short period of time but not over such a long time scale.

Also my work place is has a ridged policy about being late for work, and this can cause disciplinary measures to be taken if you are consistently late. The Tram works and the warnings of changes were so inaccurate that it became imposable to be sure of your time of arrival at work, I like many others would have to leave earlier than normal and then frequently just got to work on time. This was stressful as no one wants to be disciplined for something out with your control, the excuse that the bus was late was no longer accepted.

Had we kept to the original time scales for the project and in return had a first class tram net work, these inconveniences could have been acceptable, but not year after year

The complete lack of communication and lack of forward planning by those responsible was un acceptable and not only showed Edinburgh in a very poor light but also Scotland to.
